

Travel-Related Quarantine Guidance

If I am fully vaccinated, do I need to quarantine due to travel?

Vaccinated persons are not required to quarantine following travel if they meet all of the following criteria:

- Are fully vaccinated (i.e., ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, or ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine)
- Have remained asymptomatic since the travel

There is currently no time limit on how long fully vaccinated persons are considered immune.*

Persons who do not meet both of the above criteria should continue to follow current quarantine guidance for travel.

If I had COVID-19 disease, do I need to quarantine due to travel?

People with previous COVID-19 disease are not required to quarantine following travel if they meet all of the following criteria:

- Have evidence of a previous infection supported by a positive PCR or antigen test
- Are within 6 months following infection. If an investigation was done documenting the date that symptoms resolved, or the date isolation measures were discontinued for asymptomatic patients, then the 6-month period can start from that end date. If those dates are not available, then the period will start from the date of the positive laboratory test. A serology or antibody test may not be substituted for a laboratory report of a viral diagnostic test.
- Have remained asymptomatic since the travel

Persons who do not meet all 3 of the above criteria should continue to follow current quarantine guidance for travel.

If I am not vaccinated, do I need to quarantine due to travel?

KDHE is mandating a home quarantine for people in Kansas who are not fully vaccinated against COVID-19 disease or have not had COVID-19 disease within the last 6 months and have met one of the travel criteria on the KDHE website:
