Re: ALICE Training – District-Wide

Background:

At its March 12, 2018 meeting, the Board of Education received a report regarding districtwide safety and security. A list of Safety and Security Planning Considerations was presented as part of that report. Included on the list was the need for additional safety and security professional development for district and building level administration on the Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) Team.

Administration has entered into an agreement with the ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate) Training Institute. The training classes provide preparation and a plan for individuals and organizations on how to more proactively handle the threat of an aggressive intruder or active shooter event. The agreement will be for a term of 36 months beginning 6/1/2018 and ending on 05/30/2021. There will be an annual recurring price of \$16,450 for a total price over 36 months of \$49,350. The agreement also includes a one-time cost of \$3,200 for ALICE instructor class training. The total contract price over the 36 month term is \$52,550.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends board approval of a 36 month contract with the ALICE Training Institute in the amount of \$52,550 to be paid from General Funds Budget.
