Re: Scrapping Donated Vehicle

Background:

In October, 2017 a 2006 Pontiac Grand Prix was donated to Lawrence USD 497 Automotive Technology program. This happens occasionally and provides a tremendous resource for teaching students the technical requirements for automotive repair. Donated vehicles can be disassembled and students can practice repairs on equipment with fewer repercussions than working automobiles.

This item has been used in classes for over one year and is no longer viable for instruction.

Rationale:

Lawrence USD 497 Board Policy DFM states that excess or unusable district-owned property, equipment and materials shall be disposed of at the discretion of the board. The Lawrence USD 497 automotive teacher has worked with his advisory board to identify a salvage shop that would be willing to tow and take possession of the vehicle. Heartland Auto Salvage is willing to tow and salvage the vehicle for \$150.00. Funds from the disposal of this vehicle will go directly back into the automotive technology program.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends approving the disposition of the donated 2006 Pontiac Grand Prix to Heartland Auto Salvage and that any proceeds from the disposal of property go back to the automotive technology program.
