



Evaluation Findings



To what degree has the use of the device...




To what extent has the use of the device improved learning in your classes?

Select Focus Group Comments:

- **Teacher:** *“Before the pilot project, I was a really strong proponent of the iPad. As a teacher, it seemed really nice to have the iPad, but for the students, it was a bust. I think of my own kids in college and I’m thinking if we’re really doing college and career readiness, they are not using iPads [lots of nods in agreement around the table]. So, I changed my toon. I would support a MacBook.”*

Select Focus Group Comments:

- **Student:** *"In general there is a clearly superior device for the majority of the classes and that is the MacBook."*
- **Parent:** *"My son is a sophomore and has a writing disability and gets some accommodations. He was in a blended learning classroom freshman year and went from flunking classes [before blended] to breezing through classes with technology support. We bought him a laptop for this school year, but during the pilot study, it sat on the shelf. He said that with the iPad he can be productive but that it takes a whole lot more effort to do the same amount of work that he could get through much quicker and more efficiently on the MacBook. He would take the MacBook, hands-down."*
