<b>EMS - First Responder</b>		<b>HC3411/HC3412</b>
<p>Emergency Medical Science (EMS) - First Responder is a college course available to USD 497 juniors and seniors by Johnson County Community College (JCCC) at the Lawrence College &amp; Career Center. Students will receive 5 hours of college credit through JCCC. Students who choose to take the course will need to also apply to JCCC and enroll in the course through JCCC. Counselors and college representatives will assist in this process. There is no tuition cost and books are provided.</p> <p>The course is designed to provide training in emergency medical care for those who are apt to be the first persons responding to an emergency incident. Fire, police, civil personnel, school bus drivers, day-care providers, utility workers and industrial workers are a few examples of those persons who would benefit from this training. The student will receive both didactic and psychomotor skills training in CPR, patient assessment, fracture management, airway management and trauma management. Successful completion of this course with a minimum grade of “C” will enable the student to sit for the First Responder certification exam administered by the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services.</p> <p><b>COURSE NOTE:</b> This course is taught at the Lawrence College &amp; Career Center. <p>The course will examine law-related material and serving the general public in a variety of occupations. It is designed for students interested in the law, the legal system, public service, police services and fire science. Students in the Law and Public Service I will gain the knowledge and skills necessary for post-secondary experiences in the professions of fire rescue or law enforcement. Students will learn specific content knowledge, hands-on skills, and employment skills which focus on teamwork, problem-solving, decision making, speaking and listening, and the necessary physical skills involved within the professions. Partnerships and field trips from the Lawrence Police Department, Douglas County Sheriff, Douglas County District Attorney and Lawrence and Douglas County Fire and Medical will enhance the program.</p>

<p>This course will provide project-based experiences that build on students' knowledge of strategic communications and media production. Students will create oral, written and digital media messages for government, business and industry partners. Using critical thinking, leadership and teamwork skills, as well as technical knowledge of digital media, students will work in teams to develop, produce and deliver visual communication messaging.</p>

<p>Business Management acquaints students with management skills and effective human relations. In this course, students will be introduced to the planning, staffing, financing, and controlling functions within a business. Students will also explore the interconnections among industry, government, and the global economy. Business Management emphasizes problem-based, real-world applications of business concepts and the use of accounting concepts to formulate, analyze, and evaluate business decisions.</p>
